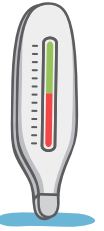
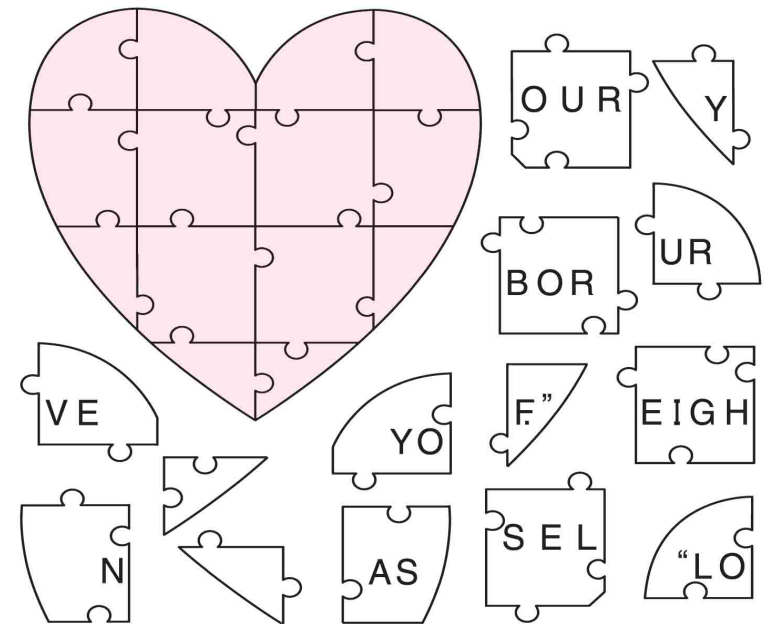
I didn't understand:

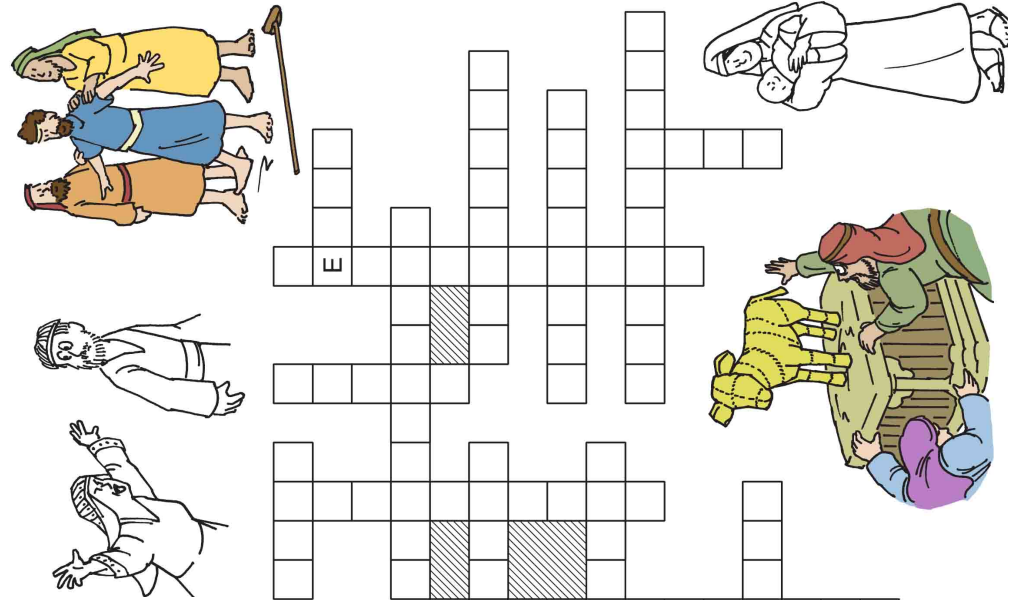
Is it hard to be obedient sometimes?

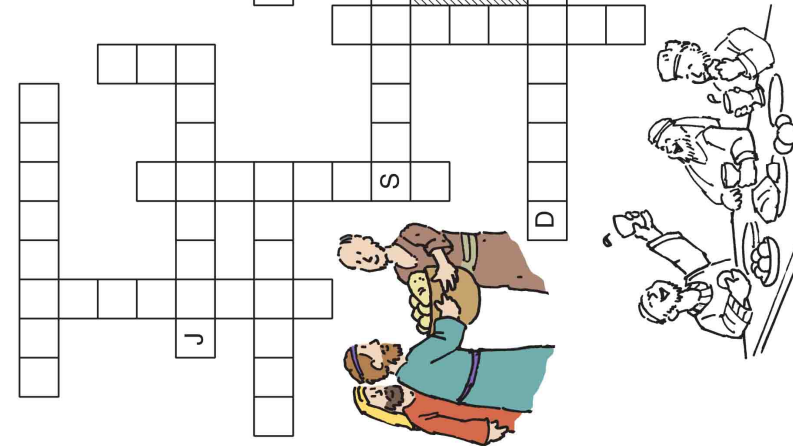
How does it feel to be obedient and do the right thing?

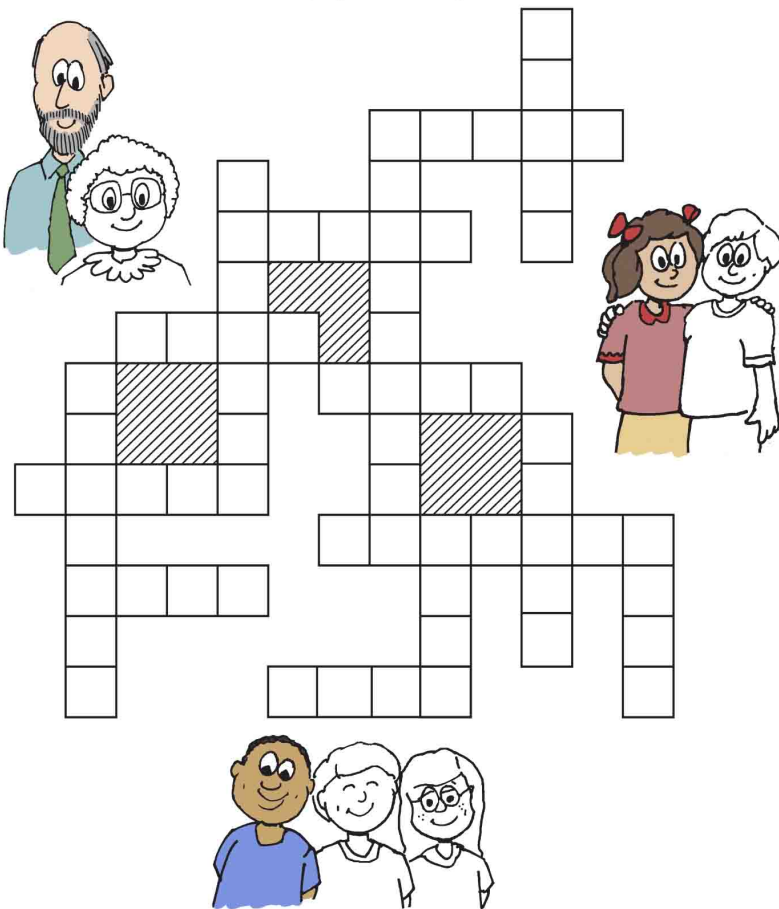
