After a hard-fought battle with Parkinson’s, Miriam Joan Hazard passed away on December 1, 2020, in her sleep at the age of 84.

Joan was born on July 28, 1936, in Independence, Missouri, to father Samuel Cassell Barrett and mother Louise Miriam Barrett, who predeceased her. She grew up in a loving family with one sister, Margaret Dianne Tinnes, who resides in Alamo, California, with her husband, Tim. Joan’s family moved to Texas and Oklahoma, and eventually to Colorado Springs when she was a senior in high school. She graduated from Cheyenne Mountain High School and attended Colorado University-Boulder and later Colorado College.

She met her husband, Gibson deKalb Hazard Jr., a student at Colorado College, at a ski weekend in Aspen. They were engaged and married within six months and celebrated their 63rd anniversary in 2020.

Joan was active in the Junior League and mentored a class of new members. She was a member and deacon of First Presbyterian Church and taught Bible study there, and at Community Bible Study, where she was also a leader. She loved playing tennis and was a Ladies Singles Champion at the Garden of the Gods Club members’ tournament. Joan also had a passion for duplicate bridge and earned her Bronze Life Master status. She was also a huge lover of all animals great and small. She was a homemaker and was the glue that held our whole family together. She was very selfless and her mission in life was to serve all of us and her God.

Joan is survived by her husband, Gibson Jr.; sister, Dianne Tinnes (Tim) of Alamo, California; sons, Gibson III and Gregory (Kathryn) of Colorado Springs; daughters, Stephanie of Vista, California, Alicia King of Las Vegas, Nevada, and Stacey Osgood (Mike) of Castle Rock, Colorado; grandchildren, Crystal Lindenbach (Matt) of Henderson, Nevada, Victoria Hazard of Denver, Matt Beresky (Karen) of Colorado Springs, Cassell and Amanda King of Las Vegas, Nevada, and Samantha, Lucianne and Annabelle of Castle Rock; great-grandchildren, Brooklyn Ruggieri and Kaylee Lindenbach.
