

Linda Boyles Inseparable in life, Arnie and Mary Lou Jacobs are now together with their Savior, having passed away within a year of one another. Mary Lou died at the age of 92 on May 25, 2020, and Arnie on June 23, 2021, a few days before his 98th birthday.

Arnie and Mary Lou's seven-decade love affair began in their hometown of Johnstown, Pennsylvania. After returning from service in World War II, Arnie took a job as a reporter for the Tribune-Democrat, where Mary Lou worked in the Advertising Department. Mary Lou loved recounting that many girls were vying for Arnie's attention and that she caught the prize. Of course, she was the prize, being the most beautiful, inside and out.

Family and friends will most remember Mary Lou as a devoted wife (Arnie's #1 fan), a loving mother and grandmother, and a steadfast friend. She had a ready smile, an unquenchable positive attitude and was known especially to her family as being game for anything.

A decorated Marine Corps veteran (Purple Heart), Arnie served in the Pacific Theatre with the Second Marine Division. Involved in combat on Saipan, Tinian and Okinawa, Arnie spoke very little about his war experience until late in his life. When his service record afforded him access to the Cheyenne Shadows golf course at Fort Carson, he found a community of current and former members of the armed forces who welcomed and honored him and Mary Lou (who often accompanied him on the course).

Active members of First Pres for four decades, Arnie and Mary Lou shared a deep commitment to living out and sharing their Christian faith. They were "lifers" with the Young Life ministry, from which Arnie retired after 55 years of service to young people throughout the U.S. and United Kingdom.

Arnie and Mary Lou are survived by son Larry (Mary Feil-Jacobs) and daughters Suzie Swenson (Terry) and Julie Babeu (Peter); seven grandchildren and four great grandchildren. Arnie is also survived by brother Duane and sisters Roma Ruth (John) and Dorthea Otto (Bradley).
