Arthur James Berglund completed his well-traveled time on Earth and teed off in heaven on December 19, 2020 at the age of 80.

Art was born in Fort Frances, Ontario, on September 4, 1940 to Liz and Eddie Berglund. While in high school, his team won the Manitoba Schoolboy Curling Championship in 1958, going on to the nationals in Prince Edward Island.

But it was ice hockey that brought Art to Colorado Springs where he played for Colorado College and was the Tigers’ leading scorer his senior year, graduating in 1963. After playing professional hockey in Switzerland and Austria, he returned to Colorado Springs which would be home for the rest of his life.

Art managed the Broadmoor World Arena for 13 years where became associated with USA Hockey. He was part of the staff of more than 30 U.S. National Teams, including six Men’s Olympic squads. He also served as a scout for the NHL St. Louis Blues and as Director of Player Recruitment for the NHL Colorado Rockies. In 1984, he joined the USA Hockey national staff, becoming Senior Director, International Administration.

The accolades and honors that Art accumulated were numerous. He was presented with The Jim Fullerton Award by the American Hockey Coaches Association and The Builders Award by USA Hockey. In 1992, he received the prestigious Lester Patrick Trophy by the NHL for service to hockey in the U.S.

He has been inducted into six different halls of fame: the Northwestern Ontario Sports Hall of Fame (2004), the Colorado College Athletic Hall of Fame (2006), the Colorado Springs Sports Hall of Fame (2008), the International Ice Hockey Federation Hall of Fame (2008), the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame (2010) and the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame (2011).

Retirement in 2005 gave Art the opportunity to devote more time to his other favorite sport, golf. A near-scratch golfer in his prime, he and his wife, Char, played countless rounds at the Broadmoor Golf Club where he was a legacy member, and on numerous courses throughout the world.

Art is reunited in heaven with his beloved Char, his older brother Jon, and his parents.

He is survived by his sister-in-law Millie Berglund; niece Linda (Joel) Krueger; nephew Michael (Paula) Berglund; great nieces and nephews Jordan, Lukas, Jon and Laura Krueger and Sam, Katy and Nick Berglund (all Minneapolis, MN); step-daughters Mary Catherine (Martin) Jacobi (Bern, Switzerland) and Josselyn Berkey (Aaron) Stern (Fort Collins, CO); and their beloved children for whom he was lovingly their “Papa Art”: Anika, Luca, Noah and Marlana Jacobi, and Parker, Cohen, Brook and Smith Stern; the Warner and Nickerson cousins; and many friends all over the world.
